



PARENT GUIDE TO CREATING YOUR POWERSCHOOL ACCOUNT

PowerSchool gives parents convenient access to important student information such as grades, attendance, assignments, and schedules.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

You will need your own email address, your student's PowerSchool Access ID and Access Password*, and your student's first and last name.

***Important:** *The Access ID and Access Password are provided by your student's school. They are different from the username and password you create for your parent account.*

CREATE YOUR ACCOUNT

1. Go to PowerSchool

Open the Culver School District PowerSchool Parent Portal and select **Create Account**.

2. Enter Your Information

Complete the **Create Parent Account** section with your first name, last name, email address, desired username, and password.

3. Add Your Student

In **Link Students to Account**, enter your student's name, Access ID, Access Password, and your relationship to the student.

4. Finish

Review your information and select **Enter** or **Create Account**. You can now sign in with the username and password you created.

WHAT CAN I SEE IN POWERSCHOOL?

- **Grades & Assignments** — Monitor current grades and assignments.
- **Attendance** — View your student's attendance and absences.
- **Schedule** — See your student's current class schedule.
- **School Information** — Access information provided by the school.
- **Multiple Students** — Link multiple students to one parent account.

ALREADY HAVE AN ACCOUNT?

You do not need to create a new account if you already have a PowerSchool parent account. Sign in using your existing username and password. If you forgot your password, use the **Forgot Username or Password?** link on the login page.

Your PowerSchool account provides access to confidential student information. **Do not share your username or password.** Always sign out when using PowerSchool on a shared or public computer.
